



kingi Private is a sophisticated, brick-lined private dining or meeting space that brings together the relaxed warmth of kingi and the refined elegance of The Libraries at The Hotel Britomart. An expansive raw-edge swamp kauri slab table sits beneath a shimmering fish-scale chandelier, while the glassboxed 'larder kitchen' gives diners fascinating glimpses of chefs preparing seasonal dishes.

The space, situated on the ground floor of the heritage Buckland Masonic Building was designed by Cheshire Architects, who also designed kingi, The Libraries and The Hotel Britomart. Tableware has been designed and hand-made by local ceramic artist Rachel Carter, while the dining chairs are sourced from local furniture maker Simon James.
